Federal Child Disability Benefit - a family can qualify for up to \$2455.00 per year (\$204.58 per month). The eligibility is discussed on the government of Canada website. A qualified practitioner fills completes the appropriate form (T2201) which is the "Disability Tax Credit Certificate". Qualified practitioners include: medical doctors, optometrists, audiologists, occupational therapists, physiotherapists, psychologists, and speech- language pathologists. If the child qualifies for this credit then they will automatically be eligible for the monthly allowance. The benefit is added to the monthly Child Tax Credit or if applicable, the Child Special Allowance which is also paid on a monthly basis.
